

From Tom Schuessler, N5HYP Field Day Coordinator: Conditions were tough, 13 phone and50 CW contacts. 3 or 4 satellite contacts for 100 point bonus. FD bulleting copied for points. 100% emergency power and public location. Short fun but frustrating was the feeling on Saturday, June 22nd for the IARC Field Day at Heritage Park. We started setting up around 10 AM and were able to get a couple multiband wire antennas in the air. Band conditions were rough because of the low solar flux count. Only a few completed satellite contacts logged but got to demonstrate the process to several. Introduced several passers by to what Amateur Radio was all about. Dodged a few lightning flashes and a drop or two in the afternoon. We started tearing down at 6P and were outta there by a bit past 7P. If you did not participate with us, we hope you did someplace.

Looking forward to "Winter Field Day" when the temperature will be much more comfortable.

On July 14th, I will be speaking to the DFW chapter of the National Space Society on AMSAT's past, present and future activities. Meeting is open to all interested at 3:30PM at Spring Creek BBQ on 183. Many thanks to Bill Byrom, N5BB for making this opportunity possible.

July 20 is the 50th anniversary of the Apollo 11 moon landing. As it has over the last 8 years or so, the Frontiers of Flight Museum will hold a large day long STEM fair featuring many topics and exhibits concerning space and space exploration. I will be there along with other hams to show off Amateur Radio Satellites to the many families and especially students. Last year 1500 people attended during the day. Dallas Amateur Radio Club will also be present.

Both events will feature the AMSAT Fox cubesat engineering model and the Fox Cubesat simulator. Students and Scouts can also earn a special commemorative Moon Day 2019 STEM patch.
