Radio In The Park, A Field Day Warm Up Tom Schuessler N5HYP

The IARC held it's second Radio in the Park day this past May 7 (Sorry, no pictures taken, that I know of). 4 of us from the IARC, plus 2 from the Arlington ARC, spent a warm and breezy afternoon operating both HF and satellite from Shady Grove Trail Park in South Irving. This was a good opportunity for some of us to try some things out prior to ARRL Field Day. I discovered that I had a battery problem for my satellite pre-amps and also realized that it will be a good thing to populate an equipment to bring checklist, instead of packing on the fly.

The upcoming IARC meeting hopefully will give the club a good opportunity to talk about the logistics, and staffing of ARRL Field Day, 2022. The location will be at TW Richardson Grove Park, 161 and 635 in North Irving. The park has been home to several joint DARC and IARC events over the last 6 month, but this time, it will just IARC as we have the site for the entire FD weekend. WE do need to discuss not only equipment that will be brought, but also accommodations for food/water/facilities and overnight staffing. WE need your participation and willingness to get on the air with us to make this a fun and enjoyable time for all.

EmComm Training Organization Operation AshfallJohn Cheyney KF5PFP

On the weekend of 14 May 2022 I participated in Operation Ashfall, an emergency communication exercise from the EmComm Training Organization (ETO). ETO is a nationwide group of amateurs who promote Winlink usage. They sponsor a weekly Winlink Thursday training where participants send a message to specific regional clearinghouses. Each training has a specific goal and instructions.

Periodically the ETO sponsors weekend drills based on a potential emergency event. The event for this exercise was the eruption of a volcanic vent at Yellowstone National Park. The event had produced a cloud of volcanic ash several miles high, depositing ash across the United States. Each station was to send a Winlink Field Situation Report (FSR) form to their regional clearinghouse. The FSR allows the user to communicate the status of local infrastructure such as telephone, television, and utility structures as well as report an actual amount of ash.

The drill had two objectives. The first was to send a message to the clearinghouse using any Winlink method possible. I sent mine via KD5EOC-10 in Denton using VARA-FM from my house.

The second objective was to send another message using Peer To Peer (P2P) connection and VARA P2P. Winlink P2P is a direct connection from on station to another, to be used when the Internet is not available and normal email isn't functioning. The ETO provided a list of specific stations nationwide on frequencies in the 80, 30, and 20 meter bands.

I started at my house. Unfortunately because of my HOA situation my antenna is limited to 40 and 20 meters and 25 watts. Despite my best efforts I couldn't make and maintain a connection.

I then went up to the Irving Office of Emergency Management (OEM) radio room to use our Kenwood TS-480SAT and our HF antenna. Although this gave me more power and more frequencies I was still unable to complete a connection. I got one connection to a station in Ponca City. Oklahoma on 30 meters but it timed out before I could complete it.
