The multiple ticket/multiple drawing system we started last year has been popular (every attendee is given a number of tickets, and each door prize is drawn individually, with the benefit of never getting a prize you aren't interested in) and was in fact picked up by the Richardson Wireless Klub for their President's Dinner this month. New Repeater Site – The paperwork and logistics have been worked-thru with the city of Irving, and I now have unfettered access to the new repeater site. I had previously purchased and assembled two racks in the shed at the base of the tower, and over the holidays the City came in and bolted down the racks. Once they were secured, I went to HRO and purchased a number of jumper cables for inside the shed (5 antenna to rack/duplexer runs, 2 repeater to duplexer runs PER REPEATER, and since we have four repeaters, that meant I purchased 13 cables), and earlier this month I put our first repeater "On The Air" from the new location, it is one of the Yaesu DR-2X repeaters w/ voice board for voice IDs, chosen because until we figure out the new SCOM 7330 controllers we purchased, we need a way to control the repeater remotely. The Yaesu repeater has two receivers, one of which can be configured as a control receiver and will listen on a different frequency for DTMF tones to control the repeater. The control information will be shared with those that have a need for it once the testing period concludes.

The new repeater was configured for our second, previously idle "coordinated" UHF repeater pair of 442.375, +5, PL 110.9 – I hope you'll add that pair to your radios and then get on the air and try it out, it's currently running 50 watts into about 100' of feedline (a mix of LMR400 and hardline), to large colinear antenna about 100' in the air. I've had reports from as far away as Richardson, and mixed-reports from closer locations. I hope to arrange an informal test in the near future – I'll configure a radio to record all the repeater transmissions for an extended period (6-24 hours), and I'll ask club members to try "hitting" the repeater as often as they can in that window. The hope is that we'll get a mix of HT, mobile, and base reports from a large number of locations in and around Irving that are reports of the location, radio, power level, and type of antenna used. Once the testing is over, we'll plot those reports on a map and try and get an idea of the coverage area. As we start to transition other repeaters to the new location, we will probably configure them with different PL/CTCSS tones and leave the old and new repeaters running in parallel, allowing individual club members to "A/B test" both locations by simply changing their PL tone to determine which repeater responds (for example transmitting with a PL tone of 110.9 will cause the current repeater to respond, and a PL tone of 167.9 will cause the new repeater to respond). We'll have a discussion about this at the meeting, but the great news is now we can roll out our equipment to the new location as we want.

Winter Field Day is this weekend, and we have reserved Heritage Park for the day on Saturday the 28th. I don't have a lot of information on what exactly we'll be doing, but for now know that it is this weekend, from about 10 AM to around 5 or 6 PM depending on our enthusiasm, stamina, weather conditions, and band conditions. I understand we are planning a low-key event, we'll have an HF setup and our new go-box, as well as a couple antennas for the radios we bring, and we'll likely have some beverages and possibly light snacks. There's no need to bring anything, but I hope you'll try and stop by for at least a while, if not longer. This is a social event as much as a "contest" event, so I hope you'll try and join us.

Well, that's it for me – I have to save something for the club meeting – I hope you'll join me at the January General meeting.
