IARC May 2025 Business Meeting

18 May 2025 Meeting via Zoom

Meeting called to order at 1830 by Ron Ford KF5OMH 9 members present Old Business:

Ron Tabb KC5HPO reported about Honor Roll and ARRL Service Club status. He contacted the ARRL and is getting more information.

Kim Bacak KC5HPO is going to change the Treasurer's reporting. She will continue to do it month to month but will make an addendum up to the day of the meeting so we have current numbers.

Field Day: Roger Bacak N5RCB has been talking to Tom Schuessler N5HYP. Tom is asking for help. Roger is going to work with Tom.

Ron Tabb KC5HPO is taking responsibility for the Christmas Party and is looking at locations and options.

Barry MacGregor N5SMW still needs to get with Bill Byrom N5BB to talk about the outstanding grants and the scholarships. Barry will work to get committee members for those events. Barry will also start getting new ideas for a By-Laws revision project.

Barry will be participating at a ScoutsBSA event in the Mid Cities at the end of May. It will be at Bedford at the Knights of Columbus. He has the latest version of the Radio Merit Badge book and is looking at options for the club to get more involved with Scouting.

Will Turk N5TLH: The club has two new repeater controllers with updated technology that need to be installed on repeaters. New computers are installed and remote radio is up. Next step is to work on moving the EchoLink node when Ken Hansen N2VIP gets back. The next club meeting will be livestreamed with a remote speaker.

John Cheyney KF5PFP: First Aid Kits are in place in the drawer and labeled. The officers do not feel the need for an AED right now.



Shane Outlaw KI5GBU: Multiple options for city events to attend and set up and pass out materials. He has sent out a lot of emails to people introducing himself and asking people to visit or attend. He is also looking into the possibility of a text based information service to get information out to members.

Ron Ford KF5OMH said officers now have designated mailboxes. The Directors do not feel like they need mailboxes.

Ron Tabb was talking to CBRE who manages the hospital where the repeater site is. He has documentation a year ago asking for our insurance. Officers decided to wait until they ask again..

New Business:

New Member application: When an application comes in the Secretary sends them an email telling them when the next meeting is and any events in between then and the next meeting. The question was asking whether we actually need to vote on members. This will be discussed during the By-Law review.

Three Year Plan: This is not something we want to look at right now but something we need to do soon.

Ron Ford KF5OMH wants every Officer and Director to come up with a Job Description for their position. He would like to be done in the next couple of months.

HamClub Online. There is a membership category called 12 Month Extension. This came after the COVID outbreak when the club decided to give everyone a free year. Ron Ford KF5OMH will reset everyone out of that category.

DFW Ham Expo PIO table: Possibility of getting a table skirt or smaller banner to use at public events. Shane Outlaw KI5GBU will look at getting one of those for the club. Ham Expo has donated a table and we have bought a table that we can use. At the next meeting the club members can go through the shack and decide what needs to be taken up there. We also need to find someone to haul it. We also need people to operate the PIO table and the sales table. Ken is working to get those tables side by side.

Roger Bacak N5RCB. The N2DFW Repeater Association is an association started in the mid 1970's by a group including IARC members. In 1978 it was relocated to the Wells Fargo bank building. They currently have four to five active members at this point. The building has been sold and the new owners want some kind of compensation. It has been listed as the backup repeater for the Irving RACES group. Roger is asking if there is any way the club can help by extending their 501(c)(3) status to cover this, which would allow the building owner to donate the cost of the location where the repeater is. The repeater is currently shown as a closed repeater, although Roger has asked that be changed. Roger is asking to extend the club's 501(c)(3) status because it's used as the backup repeater for RACES. John Cheyney KF5PFP stated he wanted to have a legal consult on what it would take to do that. Roger said that the DFW Repeater Assoc would cover the cost of a consult with a tax lawyer on whether that was legal or not. Ron Ford KF50MH said one option would be to absorb the DFW Repeater Association and all its equipment, and the club would take responsibility. The DFW Repeater Association could also apply for its own 501(c)(3) status as a separate entity. Ron offered to assist Roger with that. Ron said he could also offer a cost to the club to buy the equipment.



The club received a communication from a group that puts on running events. This would be an opportunity for the club to be involved in something. This company is a forprofit organization. Shane Outlaw KI5GBU asked if it would be possible for the organization to put our information on their information. Ron Ford did some research on the company and found very little. This will be brought up at the club meeting on Thursday to see if there is enough interest from the club to commit to the event.

Ken Hansen N2VIP found a drive-on mast support at Dayton. The club currently has his. Ron Ford KF5OMH authorized Ken to buy one to replace the one he has.

After the presentation last month, Ron told the presenter he would put out to the club whether they wanted to partner with a club in Kansas to test out this new method of emergency communication. Ron has a paragraph in the newsletter article about this for individuals interested, acting as individuals but not as the club.

Will Turk N5TLH requested that the Directors have access to HamClub Online to send out messages for committee meetings, and for other things they are involved in. Ron Ford KF5OMH will check their current status.

Roger Bacak N5RCB made a motion that the club look further into what the club could do to assist the N2DFW repeater association and prevent them from losing their repeater.

John Cheyney KF5PFP voted no.
Ron Ford KF5OMH did not vote.
All others present at the meeting voted yes.
Roger Bacak N5RCB will take that on.

John Cheyney KF5PFP will send the minutes of this meeting to Jerry Aberdeen KB3RWT for the next newsletter. He will send the notes out to the group for review.

Shack Update

Over the last two weeks we have made some major upgrades to the shack. We replaced the two Windows 10 PC's on the desks with two new Dell PC's running Windows 11 Pro, Bluetooth mice and keyboards, and 27 inch monitors. We have the remote radio back up and working.

We were not able to move the Echolink node to the shack. When we keyed up the radio on the second UHF/VHF antenna, it threw a breaker. That also showed us the batteries on at least one of the UPS's in the shack were bad. We replaced batteries in both UPS's and will make another attempt at moving the Echolink node in the near future.

We are getting rid of the old computer equipment. The laptops and the desktops that were in the shack are taken. We have two Windows 10 desktops, one desktop running Linux, and two flat screen monitors available free to any club member. If you are interested please contact John C. by email at jjcheyn@gmail.com. RACES/ ARES Corner

Siren Test

Reminder to all,

Both the IARC and Irving RACES ARES group have committed to support the monthly Irving siren (ENS -Emergency Notification System) test.

Irving has 26 sirens located through the City, on City property. All sirens rotate and make a LOUD siren type noise, with the exception of the one that is located on top of the Irving Convention Center that does not rotate.

There is always a monthly test that occurs on the first Wednesday of each month at 1:00 PM and lasts 3 minutes. There are two types of tests, a full function test, siren and rotation (if it is designed to rotate), and a silent test (rotate only if it is designed to rotate). The silent test is only done if there is any possibility of a weather threat, or any other reason the OEM (Office of Emergency Management) feels it may confuse the citizens.

We will only monitor the test for full functionality, NOT the silent test. I will notify all that has a siren assignment if the test is silent (usually before noon on the day of the test), and get confirmation you received that notification.

The individual effort will take only around 5 minutes at the location, but may take a total of 15-45 minutes, depending on travel time to and from. You MUST be close enough to your assigned location to see it rotate and sound for the full 3 minutes (ear muffs and/or ear plugs are recommended).

A list of all the sirens with the ones needing to be observed identified to choose from will be sent to all the IARC and Irving RACES ARES group members the weekend before the test. You will need to notify me of your choice, and I will conform it is yours to observe, or request you to pick another because somebody else has picked it.

We, as Amateur Radio Operators, enjoy this hobby, and this is one way we can give back to the community. This is one of the reasons the FCC has allowed us to have assigned frequencies/bands to operate on, as HAMS, to enjoy and have the skills needed to support any government entity if needed, or during times of a national emergency. It is a GREAT and fun hobby.
